The ballots will then be counted, and the changes that win a 67% majority will be implemented.

Minutes of the Membership Meeting.

Treasurer's report:

Show Report:

HO

John Ragan reported that the HO layout is experiencing problems with random short circuits. John Ragan thanked Kim Parker for offering to help tracing them. Dan Egy for continuing his work on the various electrical issues. He thanked Henry Shirley for his scenic work on the end nearest the door. He would like more members to handle the landscaping and scenery.

O

Tom Magnani thanked Mary Ann Loss, Mary Lou Ferguson and Donna Ragan for their work in gluing down the carpet tiles and working to install the vinyl base molding around the room. He reported that there has been the offer of a major O Gauge, mainly Lionel with some spectacular bridges, donation by Bill Youngblood. Bill is a former show vendor who is in the process of downsizing. In its present form it is far too big to be reassembled in our O Ga. room. This has placed John Kuchnia's work on a layout plan on hold. The goal remains to have a working O Gauge layout by the date of the NMRA tour.

Minutes of the Board of Governors Meeting

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Governors of Monday, June 6, 2016

John Ragan called the meeting to order at 7:01 PM

Tom Magnani recorded the Minutes and called the Roll.

Board members present: Bill Ferguson, Tom Magnani, John Ragan and Steve Wills.

Members present: Arthur Boone, Patrick Bradley, Clif Kelly, George Lasley and Jim Songer.

Robert Bradley was our guest.

Treasurer's report:

Steve Wills reported that he is still working on closing the year end books. His preliminary numbers support the ongoing estimate of our total expenditures for the Morrisville G gauge layout, our moving and temporary storage expenses and, the new HO layout.

There was a discussion as to which expenses should be classified as 'Building Expenses' such as the steel sheeting that was used to cover the building's original diesel-generator air intake, the donation of the wood for the raised floor in the O Ga. room, the toilet seats vs. 'Layout Expenses' such as skirting, wheels, etc.

Steve reported that he had been unable to locate the back-up materials for the Club's books which he remembered storing in the interior storage room. John Ragan sent emails to various people asking if anyone remembered moving them from their original location.

Show Status

George Lasley's reported that he has received 37 return post cards. Most confirmed for this year's show. Gains from new vendors are replacing older vendors who are dropping out of the show circuit. We are on track with last year.

Keys

It was agreed that the Club needs to maintain a tighter control over our building keys. We need to verify that only senior members are key holders and to have an up to date list of key holders. There should be a yearly recheck of the key holder status. We also need to actively retrieve keys from members who drop out or resign. Tom Magnani was instructed to begin the process of retrieving keys from recently resigned members. It was decided to have key holders sign for their keys acknowledging their responsibility for the cost, at the Board's discretion, of rekeying the locks if the key is lost. Members will be asked not to overtly label their Clubhouse key with the Club's name or address.

Show Advertising Budget

John Ragan initiated a discussion about the Show's advertising budget. Last year's expenditures were approximately \$5,500. Steve Wills would like it reduced to approximately \$3,000 as the general belief was that we did not get value for our expenditures. Additionally, we will be competing with election advertising for TWC's advertising time. If we do use TWC it will only be for the RTP area. George Lasley recommended that we continue to use the N&O and that we contact WRAL as a possible replacement for TWC. Another possibility would be the Automobile Association of America, AAA, magazine. We should have the membership plaster the bulletin boards in their local stores, super markets and libraries beginning in late August to early September.

Bob Bradley described his contact with 'Carolina Parent Magazine' which led him to think that they major obstacle we have is how they perceive us vs. their demographics at our last several shows. They think of us as a just hobby for older gentlemen as contrasted with the number of children we see with their parent and the attraction of our Lego layout at recent shows and to our members' children. Additionally; there is also 'Macaroni Kid' which is a web based weekly local newsletter of kid-friendly events and activities with specific regions such as South Raleigh, Triangle, Cary-Apex-Holly Springs, etc.; WRAL's 'Out and About' web site; the 'NC Early Childhood Association' (NCECA) which is a preschool, home school network which ties into the common core requirements for mathematics, science, technical subjects, history, etc.

There was a discussion about tying into Scouting's Merit badge program. The point was made that scouting badges are usually a 'check the box' activity with few lasting ties to a subject. Steve reminded the group that in the past our experience was that it tied up an enormous amount of member resources and cost the club quite a bit of materials for which we had fiscal issues. It was suggested that we should specifically make scouts aware of the show but not to become involved with their Merit Badge program.

There was a general discussion of corporate programs such as the CSX Community Outreach and similar rail organizations. At George Lasley's recommendation it was decided to ask Frank Simmons to contact Spencer's Site Superintendent rather than go through the NC State administration. George asked about us trying to obtain listings in Model Railroader, Railroad Model Craftsman, O Gauge Railroader, O Scale News, N Scale, the N&O's Club's page, etc.

Bob Bradley discussed his ideas for the layout of a new Club page. Michael Irwin will be asked to write a blurb on the use of card stock buildings of which a prime example are on the 'Thomas' HO layout.

By-laws changes and additions

John Ragan distributed copies of his summary of the proposed changes and amendments to the By-laws for preliminary review and comment by the Board.

Great Train Show

The Great Train Show, also listing their Raleigh show for Sept. 16th and 17th on their site has yet to appear on the Fairgrounds' calendar. George will research it as we would like to have a table there.

NMRA's Mid-Eastern Region Convention

The Club will participate in the NMRA's Mid-Eastern Region Convention. It will run from Thursday October 20th, 2016 through Sunday October 23rd, 2016. The Club will participate in the open house on Saturday, October 22nd and Sunday, October 23rd. A sign-up sheet will be posted.

O Gauge Layout

Tom Magnani reported that there has been the offer of a major O Gauge, mainly Lionel with some spectacular bridges, donation by Bill Youngblood. Bill is a former show vendor who is in the process of downsizing. Its major features are: an 054 hand built trestle, a bridge copied from the North Boggy Creek Railroad Bridge in Atoka County, Oklahoma, approximately 8 – 072 Lionel turnouts with controllers, 2 – 042 turnouts which will require replacement, quite a bit of Lionel tubular track and the underlying tables. The layout is presently in a bonus room over his garage and, except for the trestle section, is designed to be lowered through a removable 4' x 8' floor/ceiling panel. The curved trestle will need to be carefully carried down the stairs to the ground floor. In its present form it is far too big to be reassembled in our O Ga. room.

He, AB and John Ragan were able to see it and to discuss our moving it with Bill. Bill has asked to take it apart and has sent us sketches of the layout and its various modules. This has placed John Kuchnia's work on a layout plan on hold. The goal remains to have a working O Gauge layout by the date of the NMRA tour.
